The regular meeting of the Florin Resource Conservation District Board of Directors was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Sophia Scherman, Chair via Zoom.

General Manager Mark Madison announced to the Florin Resource Conservation District (District) Board of Directors (Board) that Sophia Scherman was awarded the 2020 Elk Grove Mayor's Volunteer Award – Residents, Neighborhoods and Community Groups category.

Assistant General Manager Bruce Kamilos recognized and thanked Mr. Madison for his 10 years of service to the District.

3. Sale of Surplus Property (APN 125-0210-013)

Mr. Kamilos introduced the item to the Board.

In summary, on October 20, 2020 the Board approved Resolution No. 10.20.20.01, declaring that real property APN 125-0210-013 was surplus. The approval of the resolution set in motion steps consistent with the Surplus Land Act to offer the property first to qualified public agencies, and subsequently to the public at large. On February 5, 2021, the Elk Grove Citizen ran a public notice announcing the public auction of the surplus real property APN 125-0210-013. The notice set the

minimum bid price at the appraised value of \$35,000. Bids were due on February 26, 2021. Staff received one (1) bid in the amount of \$38,800 from Jason Kline, owner of the School of Rock. It is noteworthy that the School of Rock property is contiguous to APN 125-0210-013. Jason Kline has long wanted to purchase the property to provide additional parking for his customers.

MSC (Mulberg/Nelson) to adopt Resolution No. 03.16.21.01 to 1) accept the bid from Jason Kline to purchase real property APN 125-0210-013 owned by the Florin Resource Conservation District and deemed surplus; 2) authorize the General Manager to execute the Agreement for Purchase and Sale and Joint Escrow Instructions to sell real property APN 125-0210-013 to Jason Kline; and 3) authorize the General Manager to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the closing of escrow with respect to the sale of the real property APN 125-0210-013.

4. Contract for Preconstruction Services for the Administration Building Tenant Improvement Project

Assistant General Manager Bruce Kamilos presented the item to the Board.

In summary, the District received proposals from three (3) qualified general contractors to provide preconstruction services for the District Administration Building Tenant Improvements Project (Project). The Building Improvements Advisory Committee separately interviewed each contractor and unanimously ranked A.P. Thomas Construction as the preferred proposer based on their interview performance and the strength of their proposal. The process used to select A.P. Thomas Construction was consistent and in accordance with the District's Public Works Construction Contracts Policy using the Design-Assist/Build method. A.P. Thomas Construction executed a contract to provide preconstruction and construction services for the Project. The contract is constructed in two (2) parts – Part I is for preconstruction services and Part II is for construction services.

MSC (Medina/Gray) to 1) adopt Resolution No. 03.16.21.02 amending the Elk Grove Water District Fiscal Year 2021-25 Capital Improvement Program and approving an appropriation of \$21,772 from future capital improvement reserve funds to the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Capital Improvement Program Budget and amending the Elk Grove Water District Fiscal Year 2020-21 Operating Budget appropriating an additional \$21,772 from operating reserves to fund expenditures in excess of revenues for fiscal year 2020-21; and 2) authorize the General Manager to execute a contract with A.P. Thomas, in the amount of \$21,772, to provide preconstruction services for the District Administration Building Tenant Improvements Project.

5. California Special Districts Association Board of Directors Call for Nominations – Sierra Network Seat A

Finance Manager Patrick Lee presented the item to the Board.

In summary, the California Special Districts Association (CSDA) is calling for nominations for Board of Directors to be placed on the ballot for Sierra Network, Seat A. The term of office will begin on January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2024. The CSDA Board of Directors (CSDA Board) governing body is responsible for all policy decisions related to the CSDA's member services, legislative advocacy, education, and resources.

The Board chose not to nominate anyone.

MINUTES OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE COMMITTEE OF THE FLORIN RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS

This was a posted meeting and no members of the public were present.

1. Draft Fiscal Year 2022-2026 Capital Improvement Program

Assistant General Manager Bruce Kamilos presented the Draft Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-26 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) to the members of the Infrastructure Committee (Committee).

Mr. Kamilos informed the Committee that the utility crew has become good at installing water mains and are getting into their stride. He also mentioned that COVID-19 played havoc on the CIP, causing projects to pack up and be carried over to the new fiscal year.

It was mentioned that the Elk Grove Water District/Florin Resource Conservation District (District) has come up with a new cost accounting approach in capital projects. Instead of carrying over the unspent funds, the money will just go back into the reserve funds and it will be up the Florin Resource Conservation District (FRCD) Board of Directors (Board) to decide if they want to approve more money in the new year.

Mr. Kamilos presented the 5-year CIP Summary (Table 1), which summarizes all projects for the next five (5) years. He mentioned staff took Paul Lindsay's suggestion from last year and changed the layout of the CIP to show the highest priority project at the top to the lowest priority at the bottom.

A discussion was held on the Backyard Water Mains Project. Director Bob Gray asked how much of the Backyard Water Mains Project will be contracted out. Mr. Kamilos responded that 2091 linear feet, equaling \$872,000 will be contracted out. He then went on to explain what water main projects would be taking place in FY 2021-22.

Mr. Kamilos went over the Well Rehabilitation Program. He mentioned the District is going with a different strategy than what has been done in the past. The District is not going to spend money on chemicals, but instead will concentrate on mechanical agitation of the well's screened intervals.

Mr. Kamilos went over the Service Line Replacements (Pavement Repairs) job. He explained the District got bids from three (3) competent paving contractors to help fill in the potholes, using the city's standards, left from the Service Line Replacement Project that was completed in FY 2018-19.

Mr. Kamilos went over a few other jobs that were taking place, including the new Transmission Main Brinkman Court Project (Cost Share), that he added into the CIP.

A discussion was held on the New Administration Building Project. Mr. Kamilos covered the total amount of the project, \$2.6 million, which includes the fiber optic cable and all the line items that went into that amount.

Mr. Kamilos explained that he is asking the Infrastructure Committee to bless the request for \$4.77 million dollars to be taken to the Board for the CIP. Finance Manager Patrick Lee discussed how the request impacted the District's reserves.

The Infrastructure Committee agreed there was no need for a second meeting.

SUBJECT: **SENATE BILL 427 UPDATE**

RECOMMENDATION

This item is presented for information only. No action by the Florin Resource Conservation District Board of Directors is proposed at this time.

SUMMARY

Senate Bill 427 (SB 427) passed the Senate Governance and Finance Committee with a 5-0 vote and is receiving bipartisan support. SB 427 will next be reviewed by the Senate Public Safety Committee, although recent amendments might result in avoiding that committee.

DISCUSSION

Background

In February 2021, Senator Susan Talamantes Eggman introduced the Florin Resource Conservation District's proposed water theft legislation as Senate Bill 427. This legislation has been developed, in general, to allow water agencies the ability to increase fines for water theft from \$100 to \$1,000 for a first violation, escalating for subsequent violations. During water theft, contamination can occur when non-potable sources are illegally connected to a drinking water system. This higher fine amount would create a more significant deterrent for contractors to stop illegally connecting to water systems, thereby reducing the threat to public health.

Present Situation

In March 2021, the Senate Governance and Finance Committee initiated its review of SB 427. Staff, along with Ryan Ojakian of the Regional Water Authority (RWA), met with the Governance and Finance Committee consultants and Senator Eggman's staff to answer questions about the bill. From this meeting, two (2) amendments to the bill were included to: 1) require agencies to develop a process for granting hardship waivers and 2) bifurcate water theft into two (2) categories (meter tampering and all other forms of water theft). An example of meter tampering is when residents who have had their water shut off break into the meter to turn the water back on. If the water theft is committed via meter tampering, the fines will be \$130 for a first violation, \$700 for a second violation within one (1) year, and \$1,300 for each additional violation within one (1) year. All other forms of water theft which include contractors making illegal connections to fire hydrants will have fines of \$1,000, \$2,000, and \$3,000 for first, second and additional violations respectively within one (1) year.

SENATE BILL 427 UPDATE

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On April 8, 2021, Senate Bill 427 was heard in the Governance and Finance Committee. Senator Eggman introduced the bill and Ryan Ojakian and General Manager Mark Madison testified in support. Kris Anderson of the Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) called in to support the bill. There were no calls or testimony in opposition. Senator McGuire, Chair of the Governance and Finance Committee also stated that the bill has bipartisan support and received a 5-0 vote of support from the Committee.

SB 427 may now be referred to the Senate Public Safety Committee for review although an amendment made in March may eliminate the need for their review. That amendment included replacing the term "infraction" with the term "administrative fine." The Public Safety Committee was interested when using the term "infraction" as their duty is to investigate and study bills amending the Penal Code, criminal procedures, and other statutes of a penal nature. Functionally the bill does not change with this amendment and water agencies will still be able to enact ordinances to administer these water theft fines.

Staff will continue to work with Senator Eggman's office, Ryan Ojakian and Kris Anderson to ensure SB 427 is voted upon and passed.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

There are no direct environmental considerations associated with this report.

RECOMMENDATION

This item is presented for information only. No action by the Florin Resource Conservation District Board of Directors is proposed at this time.

SUMMARY

Staff is presenting the quarterly budget status report through the third quarter of fiscal year 2020-21. This report is to keep the Florin Resource Conservation District (District) Board of Directors (Board) and the public informed on the financial status of the Elk Grove Water District (EGWD).

DISCUSSION

Background

On June 16, 2020, the Board approved the Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-21Elk Grove Water District (EGWD) Budget. The adopted FY 2020-21 EGWD Budget has total revenues of approximately \$15.424 million and total expenditures of approximately \$15.769 million, including appropriations into the EGWD FY 2020-2021 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) reserves of approximately \$1.430 million.

On June 22, 2020, the Board held a Special Board Meeting and amended the FY 2020-21 EGWD Operating Budget and the EGWD FY 2021-2025 CIP by increasing the appropriation to the CIP reserves by \$2.0 million, resulting in total expenditures of \$17.769 million, including appropriations of \$3.430 million to the FY 2020-21 CIP reserves.

At the November 17, 2020 regular Board meeting, the Board amended the FY 2020-21 EGWD Operating Budget and the EGWD FY 2021-2025 CIP by increasing the appropriation to capital reserves by \$0.25 million and an appropriation to the operating budget of \$1.7 million, resulting in total appropriations of \$19.734 million in expenditures, including \$3.685 million to the FY 2020-21 CIP reserves.

At the March 16, 2021 Regular Board Meeting, the Board amended the FY 2020-21 EGWD Operating Budget and the EGWD FY 2021-2025 CIP by increasing the appropriation to capital

reserves by \$21,772, resulting in total appropriations of \$19.756 million in expenditures, including \$3.707 million to the FY 2020-21 CIP reserves.

The projected expenditures in excess of revenues of approximately \$4.332 million will be funded by transfers from excess operating reserves from prior years.

Present Situation

A summary of the EGWD's financial status as of March 31, 2021 (Attachment 1) is provided and a detailed analysis of the changes in each revenue and expenditure category is as follows:

The revenues collected through the third quarter of the fiscal year total \$12,418,496 which is 81.67% of the \$15,424,142 annual budget. The revenues are \$387,212 or 3.75% above the same quarter of the prior year.

Total Operational Expenses were \$7,072,244 through the third quarter, which is 68.43% of the annual operating budget of \$10,334,274. The actual operating expenses were \$89,825 or 1.29% above the same quarter of the prior fiscal year as follows:

Personnel expenditures total \$2,967,458 which is 74.26% of the \$3,996,057 annual budget. The actual expenses were \$93,078 or 3.24% above the same period of the prior fiscal year. The increase is due mainly to the salaries for three (3) Water treatment Operators who were not hired until November of 2019, as well as an increase in contributions related to OPEB as a result of a new actuarial valuation being conducted.

Seminars, Conventions and Travel expenditures total \$3,913, which is 7.34% of the annual budget of \$53,307. The actual expenses were \$25,872 or 86.86% below the same period of the prior fiscal year due mainly to conferences and seminars transitioning to webinars and broadcasts due to COVID-19, which eliminated the need for traveling.

Office and Operational expenditures total \$806,604, which is 60.26% of the annual budget of \$1,338,578. The actual expenses were \$90,412 or 10.08% below the same period of the prior fiscal year due mainly to a decrease in spending for meter repairs and a decrease in equipment repair as a result of postponing all capital projects due to COVID-19.

Estimated Purchased Water costs total \$2,403,775, which is 75.16% of the annual budget of \$3,198,404. The actual expenses were \$139,738 or 6.17% above the same period of the prior fiscal year. The increase in costs is due mainly to an increase in the total number of accounts in Service Area 2 and an overall increase in water consumption in Service Area 2.

Outside Services expenditures total \$568,354, which is 44.28% of the annual budget of \$1,283,548. The actual expenses were \$20,175 or 3.43% below the same period of the prior

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fiscal year. The decrease is due mainly to a decrease in engineering costs offset by an increase in contracted services related to temporary staffing as a result of COVID-19, consulting services related to the development of RFP's for the Emergency Response Plan and an increase in janitorial services related to COVID-19.

Equipment Rent, Taxes and Utilities expenditures total \$322,140, which is 69.37% of the annual budget of \$464,380. The actual expenses were \$6,532 or 1.99% below the same period of the prior fiscal year. The decrease is due mainly to the timing of when Sacramento Municipal Utility District invoices are received and processed for payment. March invoices have not yet been received and paid.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

There are no direct environmental considerations associated with this report.

STRATEGIC PLAN CONFORMITY

This item conforms to the FRCD/EGWD's 2020-2025 Strategic Plan. Development and adoption of annual budgets that are balanced through cost saving measures or transfers from operating reserves is specifically identified as an objective in the Fiscal Responsibility section of the Strategic Plan.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

This report is provided to the Board for information only. There is no financial impact associated with this item at this time. Staff has provided a copy of the March 31, 2021 Quarterly Budget Review (Attachment 2) for the third quarter. The Quarterly Budget Review includes the line-item detail for the expenditure categories for the quarter-to-date for FY 2020-21, as well as the detail for last year's quarter-to-date.

CAPITAL RESERVE STATUS REPORT

RECOMMENDATION

This item is presented for information only. No action by the Florin Resource Conservation District Board of Directors is proposed at this time.

SUMMARY

On June 16, 2020, the Florin Resource Conservation District (District) Board of Directors (Board) adopted the District's Reserve and Capital Investments Policy (Policy), establishing the funding levels for each of the District's respective reserve funds. Per the Policy, the District's unrestricted net position is allocated first to the Operating Reserve (120 days of budgeted operating and maintenance expenses), then to the Fiscal Year 2020-21 capital budget, followed by elections/special studies, with the balance allocated to future capital improvements and future capital replacements in the ratio of 75:25, respectively. The total unrestricted net position that is available to be allocated to reserves at July 1, 2020 was \$18,314,558.

Through the third quarter of Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-21, the District expended \$2,464,878 for capital projects and \$1,887 for elections. The total amount expended of \$2,464,878 for capital projects includes \$31,651 of expenditures related to projects carrying over from prior year but not budgeted for in the FY 2020-21 CIP program. Per Resolution No. 11.17.20.02, the District also expended \$1,628,039 from excess operating reserves to pay down the unfunded accrued liabilities with CalPERS, leaving a remaining total reserve balance at March 31, 2021 of \$14,219,754.

DISCUSSION

Background

On June 16, 2020, the Board approved the FY 2020-21 Elk Grove Water District (EGWD) Operating Budget and the EGWD Capital Improvement Program (CIP) that included an appropriation of \$15.769 million in expenditures, including \$1.430 million in unrestricted funds to the FY 2020-21 CIP reserve funds.

On June 22, 2020, the Board held a Special Board Meeting and amended the FY 2020-21 EGWD Operating Budget and the EGWD FY 2021-2025 CIP by increasing the appropriation to

capital reserves by \$2.0 million, resulting in an appropriation of \$17.769 million in expenditures, including \$3.430 million to the FY 2020-21 CIP reserves.

At the November 17, 2020 regular Board meeting, the Board amended the FY 2020-21 EGWD Operating Budget and the EGWD FY 2021-2025 CIP by increasing the appropriation to capital reserves by \$0.25 million and an appropriation to the operating budget of \$1.7 million, resulting in total appropriations of \$19.734 million in expenditures, including \$3.685 million to the FY 2020-21 CIP reserves.

At the March 16, 2021 regular Board meeting, the Board amended the FY 2020-21 EGWD Operating Budget and the EGWD FY 2021-2025 CIP by increasing the appropriation to capital reserves by \$21,772, resulting in total appropriations of \$19.756 million in expenditures, including \$3.707 million to the FY 2020-21 CIP reserves.



SUBJECT: LEGISLATIVE MATTERS AND POTENTIAL DIRECTION TO STAFF

RECOMMENDATION

This item is presented as information although the Florin Resource Conservation District Board of Directors may provide an action to authorize staff to respond to a legislative item.

SUMMARY

There are several bills that have been introduced in the 2021 legislative session that could potentially impact the Florin Resource Conservation District/Elk Grove Water District (District) if passed. The District sent a letter to the Assembly Water, Parks, & Wildlife Committee in opposition of AB 1434 (attached).

DISCUSSION

Background

The Florin Resource Conservation District (FRCD) Board of Directors (Board) is periodically updated on legislative and regulatory issues.

Present Situation

The following bills have been introduced in the 2021 legislative session that could potentially impact the District if passed in their current form.

AB 59 (Gabriel) Mitigation Fee Act: fees: notice and timelines

This bill would increase the time for mailing the notice of the time and place of the meeting to at least 45 days before the meeting for fee and service changes like water connection or capacity charges. The bill would also remove the statute of limitation for challenges to these fee and service changes. California Special Districts Association (CSDA) has taken an oppose position stating "This bill would leave public water and sewer agencies vulnerable to litigation in perpetuity would undermine the ability of these agencies to properly plan for and finance essential services needed to accommodate new development."

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AB 95 (Low) Employees: bereavement leave

Would enact the Bereavement Leave Act of 2021. The bill would require an employer with 25 or more employees to grant an employee up to 10 business days of unpaid bereavement leave upon the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, grandparent, grandchild, or domestic partner, in accordance with certain procedures, and subject to certain exclusions. The bill would require an employer with fewer than 25 employees to grant up to 3 business days of leave, in accordance with these provisions. The bill would prohibit an employer from interfering with or restraining the exercise or attempt to exercise the employee's right to take this leave. CSDA has taken an Oppose position.

AB 100 (Holden) Drinking water: pipes and fittings: lead content

The California Safe Drinking Water Act prohibits, with certain exceptions, the use of any pipe, pipe or plumbing fitting or fixture, solder, or flux that is not lead free in the installation or repair of any public water system or any plumbing in a facility providing water for human consumption. The act defines "lead free" for purposes of conveying or dispensing water for human consumption to mean not more than 0.2% lead when used with respect to solder and flux and not more than a weighted average of 0.25% lead when used with respect to the wetted surfaces of pipes and pipe fittings, plumbing fittings, and fixtures. This bill would additionally define "lead free," with respect to endpoint devices, as defined, to mean that the devices do not leach more than one microgram of lead under certain tests and meeting a specified certification.

AB 252 (Rivas) Department of Conservation: Multibenefit Land Repurposing Incentive Program: administration

Would require the Department of Conservation to establish and administer a program named the Multibenefit Land Repurposing Incentive Program for purposes of providing grants to groundwater sustainability agencies or counties, or other specified entities designated by groundwater sustainability agencies or counties, for the development or implementation of local programs supporting or facilitating multibenefit land repurposing at the basin scale. The bill would establish procedures for the department's administration of the program and would require the department to develop guidelines to implement the program and to exercise its expertise and discretion in awarding program funds to eligible applicants. CSDA has taken a Watch position.

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AB 339 (Lee) State and local government: open meetings

This bill would require all meetings, including gatherings using teleconference technology, to include an opportunity for all persons to attend via a call-in option or an internet-based service option that provides closed captioning services and requires both a call-in and an internet-based service option to be provided to the public. CSDA has taken an Oppose position.

AB 361 (Rivas) Open meetings: local agencies: teleconferences

Would authorize a local agency to use teleconferencing without complying with the teleconferencing requirements imposed by the Ralph M. Brown Act when a legislative body of a local agency holds a meeting for the purpose of declaring or ratifying a local emergency, during a declared state or local emergency, as those terms are defined, when state or local health officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, and during a declared local emergency provided the legislative body makes certain determinations by majority vote. CSDA is a sponsor of this bill.

AB 377 (Rivas) Water quality: impaired waters

Would require all California surface waters to be fishable, swimmable, and drinkable by January 1, 2050, as prescribed. The bill would prohibit the state board and regional boards from authorizing an NPDES discharge, waste discharge requirement, or waiver of a waste discharge requirement that causes or contributes to an exceedance of a water quality standard, or from authorizing a best management practice permit term to authorize a discharge that causes or contributes to an exceedance of a water quality standard in receiving waters. The bill would prohibit, on or after January 1, 2030, a regional water quality control plan from including a schedule for implementation for achieving a water quality standard that was adopted as of January 1, 2021, and would prohibit a regional water quality control plan from including a schedule for implementation of a water quality standard that is adopted after January 1, 2021, unless specified conditions are met. CSDA has taken an Oppose position.

AB 1434 (Friedman) Urban water use objectives: indoor residential water use

This bill would establish, beginning January 1, 2023, until January 1, 2025, the standard for indoor residential water use as 48 gallons per capita daily. The bill would establish, beginning January 1, 2025, the standard as 44 gallons per capita daily and, beginning January 1, 2030, 40 gallons per capita daily. The bill would eliminate the requirement that the department, in coordination with the state board, conduct necessary studies and investigations and jointly recommend to the Legislature a standard for indoor residential

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water use. The Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) and CSDA have taken an Oppose position and Elk Grove Water District has sent a letter of opposition to the Assembly Water, Parks, & Wildlife Committee.

AB 1500 (Multiple) Safe Drinking Water, Wildfire Prevention, Drought Preparation, Flood Protection, Extreme Heat Mitigation, and Workforce Development Bond Act of 2022

This bill would enact the Safe Drinking Water, Wildfire Prevention, Drought Preparation, Flood Protection, Extreme Heat Mitigation, and Workforce Development Bond Act of 2022, which, if approved by the voters, would authorize the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$6,700,000,000 pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law to finance projects for safe drinking water, wildfire prevention, drought preparation, flood protection, extreme heat mitigation, and workforce development programs. CSDA has taken a Support if amended position.

SB 45 (Portantino) Wildfire Prevention, Safe Drinking Water, Drought Preparation, and Flood Protection Bond Act of 2022

Would enact the Wildfire Prevention, Safe Drinking Water, Drought Preparation, and Flood Protection Bond Act of 2022, which, if approved by the voters, would authorize the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$5,510,000,000 pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law to finance projects for a wildfire prevention, safe drinking water, drought preparation, and flood protection program. CSDA has taken a Support if amended position.

SB 95 (Skinner) Employment: COVID-19: supplemental paid sick leave

On March 19, 2021, Governor Newsom signed into law SB 95, codifying new obligations on public agency employers to provide eighty hours of COVID-19 Supplemental Paid Sick Leave to employees who are unable to work or telework and have certain qualifying reasons for such paid leave. SB 95 provides a new employee entitlement to such leave retroactive to January 1, 2021 and effective through September 30, 2021.

SB 222 (Dodd) Water Affordability Assistance Program

Would establish the Water Affordability Assistance Fund in the State Treasury to help provide water affordability assistance, for both drinking water and wastewater services, to low-income ratepayers and ratepayers experiencing economic hardship in California. The bill would make moneys in the fund available upon appropriation by the Legislature to the state board to provide, as part of the Water Affordability Assistance Program

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established by the bill, direct water bill assistance, water bill credits, water crisis assistance, affordability assistance, and short-term assistance to public water systems to administer program components. CSDA has taken an Oppose unless amended position.

SB 223 (Dodd) Discontinuation of residential water service

Current law prohibits an urban and community water system, defined as a public water system that supplies water to more than 200 service connections, from discontinuing residential water service for nonpayment until a payment by a customer has been delinquent for at least 60 days. Current law requires an urban and community water system to have a written policy on discontinuation of residential service for nonpayment, including, among other things, specified options for addressing the nonpayment. Current law requires an urban and community water system to provide notice of that policy to customers, as provided. This bill would apply those provisions, on and after July 1, 2022, to a very small community water system, defined as a public water system that supplies water to 200 or fewer service connections used by year-long residents. CSDA has taken an Oppose unless amended position.

SB 230 (Portantino D) State Water Resources Control Board: Constituents of Emerging Concern Program

Would require the State Water Resources Control Board to establish, maintain, and direct an ongoing, dedicated program called the Constituents of Emerging Concern Program to assess the state of information and recommend areas for further study on, among other things, the occurrence of constituents of emerging concern (CEC) in drinking water sources and treated drinking water. The bill would require the state board to convene, by an unspecified date, the Science Advisory Panel to review and provide recommendations to the state board on CEC for further action, among other duties. The bill would require the state board to provide an annual report to the Legislature on the ongoing work conducted by the panel. CSDA has taken a Support position.

SB 274 (Wieckowski) Local government meetings: agenda and documents

This bill will require public agencies to email meeting agendas and the supporting agenda packets, or a link to where they can be found on an agency's website, to members of the public that have requested them. Just like when the public requests meeting materials be mailed to them, this standing request is valid for one year. In the event that it is not technically feasible to email the meeting materials or a link to where it can be found on a website, an agency can physically mail the materials and charge the requested for the costs of the mailing. CSDA has taken a Watch position.

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SB 323 (Caballero D) Local government: water or sewer service: legal actions

This proposal would authorize a local agency or interested person to bring a validation action in a superior court to determine the validity of a fee or charge for water and sewer service. The proposal would require an interested party bring an action within 120 days after the local agency adopts the fee or charge. This bill is sponsored by ACWA and the are urging member agencies to sign on to their coalition letter. See attachment. CSDA has taken a Support position.

SB 351 (Caballero) Water Innovation Act of 2021

This bill, the Water Innovation Act of 2021, would create the Office of Water Innovation at the California Water Commission for the furtherance of new technologies and other innovative approaches in the water sector. The bill would require the office, by December 31, 2023, to take specified measures to advance innovation in the water sector. The bill would make findings and declarations regarding the need for water innovation. CSDA has taken a Support position.

SB 443 (Newman) Election: redistricting

This bill would make the criteria for the district boundaries of a county board of education, school district, community college district, special district, city, or county consistent with the criteria for Senate, Assembly, Congress, and State Board of Equalization districts established under the Constitution. CSDA has taken a Watch position.

H.R.535 (Garamendi) and S.91 (Kyrsten)

H.R. 535 and S. 91, the Special Districts Provide Essential Services Act, were introduced on January 28 to provide special districts with direct access to future local government pandemic relief. The Special Districts Provide Essential Services Act would establish a federal definition for "special district." It would require states to direct at least 5 percent of future Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) allocations to their special districts. States would have the discretion to establish their own programs to disburse the funds to special districts demonstrating pandemic-related need for relief. States would have flexibility to use excess funds, should the U.S. Treasury permit, after 60 days should special districts' declared needs be met. The bills would also codify districts' access to the Federal Reserve's Municipal Liquidity Facility. CSDA is in support of this bill and is asking members to send a letter of support to their members of Congress as well as U.S. Senators Dianne Feinstein and Alex Padilla to share why the legislation is important for special districts and their constituents.

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Staff will continue to monitor these bills along with any other bills which may affect District operations.

RE: AB 1434 (Friedman) - Indoor Residential Water Use Standards - OPPOSE

Dear Chair Garcia,

On behalf of Elk Grove Water District, I am writing to respectfully Oppose AB 1434, which would arbitrarily change the indoor water use standards established by AB 1668 (Friedman, 2018). This bill proposes to incrementally lower the indoor water use standard starting January 1, 2023 to reach a standard of 40 gallons per capita daily (GPCD) starting in 2030. Further, the bill removes the requirement for the Department of Water Resources (DWR), in consultation with the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board), to submit a report (DWR Report) on the result of its indoor water use studies and make recommendations regarding the existing standards.

AB 1668 and SB 606 (Hertzberg, 2018) were a package of bills that implemented new water use efficiency standards, of which one part is the indoor water use standard this bill proposes to change. The provisions in these two bills were closely negotiated by stakeholders in the water community, as well as members of the Legislature and environmental community. An important component of those negotiations was the requirement for DWR to conduct studies to identify a standard for indoor residential water use that reflects best practices.

The DWR Report was due January 1, 2021 but has not yet been made public. It is anticipated, based on the existing statutory requirements, that any forthcoming report or set of recommendations would be in draft form, because it is required by law to be finalized in collaboration with, and input from, stakeholders. Stakeholders have not yet seen any draft study results or recommendations from DWR or the State Water Board.

Our agency supports evidence-based decision making, and this bill does not rely on evidence because the DWR Report has not yet been finalized or released to the public.

This bill is premature and goes back on the agreements that were made when AB 1668 and SB 606 were passed and signed into law. Changes to the indoor water use standards should not even be considered prior to the final DWR Report being released. The new indoor use standards in this bill are not based on robust findings and an analysis of the benefits and impacts of how the changing standard will impact water and wastewater management, including potable water use, wastewater, recycling and reuse systems, infrastructure, operations, and supplies.

For these reasons, Elk Grove Water District has serious concerns about this bill and respectfully requests your "No" vote when it is heard in the Assembly Committee on Water, Parks & Wildlife.

RECOMMENDATION

This item is presented for information only. No action by the Florin Resource Conservation District Board of Directors is proposed at this time.

SUMMARY

The Elk Grove Water District (EGWD) Operations Report is a standing item on the regular board meeting agenda.

All regulatory requirements were met for the month of March. Other notable events are described below.

DISCUSSION

Background

Every month, staff presents an update of the activities related to the operations of the EGWD. Included for the Florin Resource Conservation District Board of Director's review is the EGWD's March 2021 Operations Report.

Present Situation

The EGWD March 2021 Operations Report highlights are as follows:

- Operations Activities Summary No door hangers were placed for past due balances. The district is currently suspending all shut offs due to the present COVID-19 pandemic. We received three (3) water pressure complaints and three (3) water quality complaints. Upon inspection, all water complaints were unsubstantiated.
- Production The Combined Total Service Area 1 production graph on page 13 shows that production during the month of March decreased 0.37 percent compared to March 2020 and is 21.52 percent less than what was produced in 2013. Year 2013 is the baseline year the State Water Resources Control Board

adopted for water usage. The Total Demand/Production for both service areas on page 14 shows that customer use during the month of March, compared to March 2013, was down by 14.77 percent.

- Static and Pumping Level Graphs The first quarter soundings are shown and generally indicate that the static water levels in deeper zones have risen slightly compared to the first quarter of 2019. The shallow zones are nearly the same.
- Treatment (Compliance Reporting) All samples taken during the month comply
 with all regulatory permit requirements. No exceedances of any maximum
 contaminant levels were found, and all water supplied to EGWD's customers met
 or exceeded safe drinking water standards.
- Corrective Maintenance Program The tables included in this section of the report also include certain activities completed to date. Below is a list of out-ofordinary maintenance work completed in March:
 - Staff completed retrofitting well #9 Polhemus with a new magnetic flowmeter and converter. The previous propeller type meter had become undependable.
 - Staff replaced a faulty phase failure relay (PFR) in the Motor Control
 Cabinet at well #11D Dino. The defective part was triggering false alarms and
 as a result, would not permit the well to run automatically.
 - Staff investigated and repaired a malfunctioning electric actuated butterfly valve. The valve is partly responsible for automatically opening and closing one of the media filters at the Railroad Water Treatment Plant.
- Cross Connection Control Program 2021 EGWD issued 83 testing notices for the month. Pursuant to the notices, 69 devices passed. Of the 14 remaining, seven (7) of the devices passed the second test and seven (7) were not tested by the due date. The total number of delinquents is seven (7).
- Safety Meetings/Training Four (4) safety training sessions were conducted for the month which is compliant with OSHA standards.
- Service and Main Leaks Map There was one (1) service line leak and zero main line leaks during March.
- System Pressures Pressures in Service Area 1 generally remained stable during the month of March. Pressures in Service Area 2, which are controlled by

Sacramento County Water Agency, were also stable as compared to the previous month.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

There are no direct environmental considerations associated with this report.

 - a. Samples required pursuant to 22 CCR Section 64423 and any additional samples required by an approved routine sample siting plan established pursuant to 22 CCR Section 64422
 - b. Extra samples are required for systems collecting less than five routine samples per month that had one or more total coliform positives in previous month;
 - Extra samples for systems with high source water turbidities that are using surface water or groundwater under direct influence of surface water and do not practice filtration in compliance with regulations;
- Note: For a repeat sample following a total coliform positive sample, any E.coli positive repeat (boxed entry) constitutes an MCL violation and requires immediate notification to the Division (22, CCR, Section 64426.1).
- Note: For repeat sample following a E.coli positive sample, any total coliform positive repeat (boxed entry) constitutes an MCL violation and requires immediate notification to the Division (22, CCR, Section 64426.1).
- Note: Failure to take all required repeat samples following an E. coli positive routine sample (22, CCR, Section 64426.1) constitutes an MCL violation and requires immediate notification to the Division (22, CCR, Section 64426.1).
- Note: Failure to test for E. coli when any repoeat sample tests postive for total coliform (22, CCR, Section 64426.1) constitutes an MCL violation and requires immediate notification to the Division (22, CCR, Section 64426.1).
- 6. Note: Second Level 1 treatment technique trigger in a rolling 12-month period.
- 7. Total coliform Treatment Technique (TT) Violation (Notify Department within 24 hours of TT violation):
 - a. For systems collecting less than 40 samples, if two or more samples are total coliform positive, then the TT is violated and a Level 1 Assessment is required
 - b. For systems collecting 40 or more samples, if more than 5.0 percent of samples collected are total coliform positive, then the TT is violated and a Level 1 Assessment is required.
- Contact the Division as soon as practical to arrange for the division to conduct a Level 2 Assessment of the water system. The water system shall complete a Level 2 Assessment and sumbit it to the Division within 30 days of learning of the trigger exceedance.
- 9. Conduct a Level 1 Assessment in accordance with as soon as practical that covers the minimum elements (22, CCR, Section 64426.8 (a), (2). Submit the report to the Division within 30 days of learing of the trigger exceedance.
- 10. Positive results and their associated repeat samples are to be tracked on the Coliform Monitoring Worksheet.
- 11. Repeat samples must be collected within 24 hours of being notified of the positive results. For systems collecting more than one routine sample per month, three repeat samples must be collected for each total coliform positive sample. For systems collecting one or fewer routine samples per month, four repeat samples must be collected for each total coliform positive sample. At least three samples shall be taken the month following a total coliform positive.
- 12. For systems subject to the Groundwater Rule: Positive results and the associated triggered source samples are to be tracked on the Coliform Monitoring Worksheet
- 13. For triggered sample(s) required as a result of a total coliform routine positive sample, an E.coli positive triggered sample (boxed entry) requires immediate notification to the Division, Tier 1 public notification, and corrective action.
